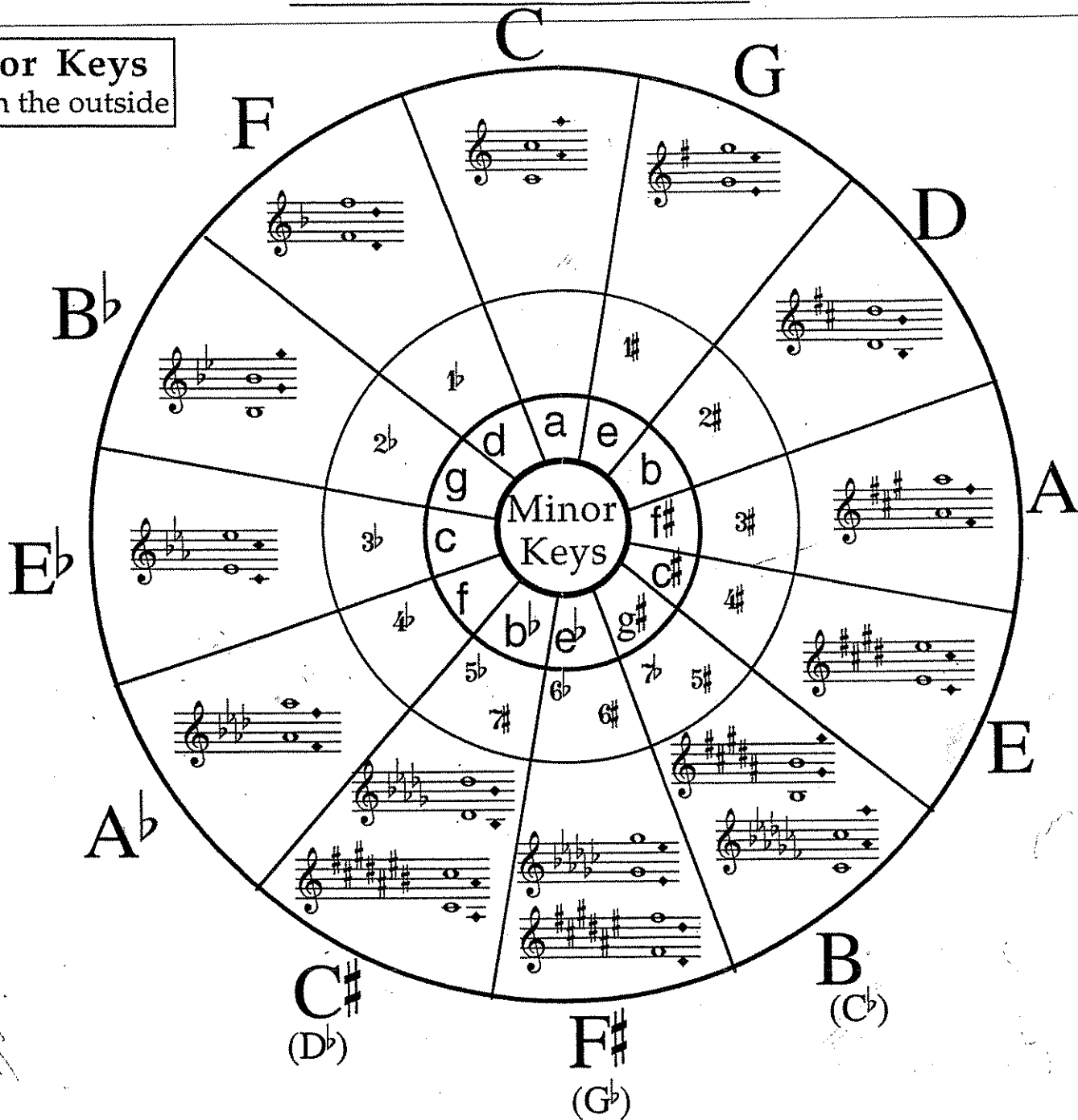


CIRCLE OF FIFTHS*

Major Keys
are on the outside



* the whole notes give the starting pitch of the major scale
**the diamond shaped note heads give the starting pitch for the minor scales.

To find your instrument's pitch:

1. find the Concert Key in the circle of fifths the director tells you
2. count up the number of scale degrees (notes) in **THAT** key for your instrument (see below)
3. take the note you land on and that is the key or scale for your instrument--go to it on the wheel above

Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, Trombone, Baritone B.C., Tuba--read as is

Bb Trumpet, Bb Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Tenor Sax, Baritone T.C.--up 2 scale degrees (including the 1st)

Alto Sax, Bari Sax--up 6 scale degrees (including the 1st)

French Horn--up 5 scale degrees (including the 1st)

Order of Flats: **B-E-A-D -Greatest-Common-Factor**

Order of Sharps **Five-Cats-Got-Drowned-At-Euclid-Beach**
